NSPCC Childhood Day Mile

You may wish to take part in Childhood Day Mile on Friday 6 June (or any day of your choice) to promote movement and to raise funds for NSPCC services. On signing up, schools receive access to lots of fun online resources and a free welcome pack with an activity spinner so that children can decide how to move their mile. Year 5 vaping and smoking sessions: case study

Holy Rood Catholic Primary School used the Mini-Police resources developed by Swindon Borough Council to reach 58 pupils across two classes in Year 5, which includes perceptions data to highlight that less pupils vape than children would expect.

Liz Galvin, Pastoral Lead and DDSL explains,

"They engaged really well and knew a little bit about smoking due to a previous lesson but did not know in depth facts about health implications.

Many children thought vaping was as bad as smoking and were surprised at the figures to do with how many young people actually did vape [fewer than they would have expected].

We also touched upon contaminated vapes and they were not aware of this... One child also mentioned about seeing 'influencers' promoting vapes.

Some raised the point that the vapes are attractive to children in the packaging and flavours so if they were not aware what they were and were offered them, they might think they were sweets.

Thank you so much for the resource, I will be using it again if that is ok."



Tell someone safe: a video resource to help you prepare children for lessons on abuse and harm prevention (primary schools)

This short 3-minute video was developed by researchers from five universities. Their research in primary schools across the UK found that children, schools and teachers would benefit from being well prepared for such lessons, whether they are delivered by external organisations or by teachers themselves, *before* they are delivered to children in classrooms.

The video, which has been designed with the help of primary school children and professional animators, uses the views and voices of children who participated in the research.


Bags of Taste: free supportive cooking offer for families and individuals

Financial support available for pregnant people and young families in Swindon

Swindon Public Health team has developed a list of financial support available for pregnant people and young families in Swindon that you will hopefully find helpful for signposting families to. The list, which is in a word document, can be downloaded here.

Help with home insulation measures to keep homes warm!

We'd appreciate your support with including the following information in your newsletters. Thank you.

Have you just come through another winter struggling to keep your home warm? If so, it could be a lack of insulation is causing heat to be lost from your home, heat that you have paid for. There are schemes available to help with the



cost of loft and cavity wall insulation, including some that don't depend on how much money you earn. For example through the Great British Insulation Scheme if you live in home with a Council Tax Band of A to D, and your home has an energy performance certificate (EPC) of D to G then you could get these measures for free. It is only for home owners or people renting from a private landlord. If you want to find out more, contact the Swindon Borough Council backed Warm & Safe Wiltshire advice service and they will be able to talk you through the options and refer you to an installer.
